Private Archway event to include unveiling of Bosselman-donated statue

Kearney, Neb. – The Archway Society will be hosting its inaugural Trailblazer fundraising event on July 31 at The Archway. The event will include unveiling a bronze statue.

The statue is being donated by the Fred A. Bosselman Family. Sculpted by Dr. David L. Biehl, the sculpture is entitled “A Narrow Escape” and depicts the story of two brother’s harrowing getaway from a Native American war party just west of Doniphan, Nebraska in 1864.

Archway Society Member Tom Henning said, “The Archway and the Archway Society would like to thank Mr. Bosselman and family for their generous donation as well as Dr. David L. Biehl for designing this detailed and amazing sculpture. It provides the perfect backdrop for our inaugural Trailblazer fundraiser.”

The private event will begin with a social hour and silent auction at 5:30. That will be followed by a brief presentation and unveiling of the statue, entitled “A Narrow Escape,” by artist Dr. Biehl. Kearney’s own Jim Salestrom will perform starting at 7 with a live auction to begin at 7:15.
